

### FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of fast and abstinence (only one full meal for those age 18-59, and no meat for those age 14 and above). All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence for those age 14 and above. On weekdays during Lent, there is no obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended.

As part of our community's observance of Lent, we ask all families to participate in Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl, a program of prayer, fasting, learning, and giving. Please be sure to take home a Rice Bowl packet
