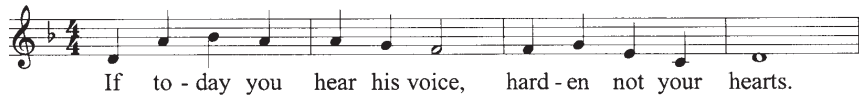

THE HEALING GRACE OF PRAYER

Every Lent Catholics from all over the region respond to "The Light Is On For You" ads and come to the sacrament of penance or to speak with a priest after being away from the Church for 10, 15 or 25 or more years. Imagine the sense of welcome and hope they would experience if they walked into a church filled with people praying and meditating in silence in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament. Join us one Wednesday, or every Wednesday, from 6:30—8:00 pm, for Adoration as we pray for people who are seeking to reconcile with God and with the Church. At St. Jane de Chantal, confessions are also heard on Saturdays, from 3:45-4:45 pm.

FOOD DRIVE

Hunger is an ever-present reality in our community. Local food pantries are experiencing a great demand for food. To help replenish supplies, Catholic Charities and the Archdiocese of Washington together are sponsoring the *Share in Hope* Food Drive this Lent. FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat) for those age 14 and above. On weekdays during Lent, there is no obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence (only one full meal for those age 18-59, and no meat for those age 14 and above).

PASTORAL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

The Pastoral Council advises and assists the pastor in achieving the goals of the parish. This includes: developing and recommending parish policies; striving to represent the needs and views of parishioners as a whole; coordinating activities among the parish organizations; and, performing other tasks to promote the mission and overall good of the parish.

The Pastoral Council does not implement programs which are the responsibility of the parish staff or parish organizations, but instead addresses issues that fall outside their purview. Some current matters in which the Pastoral Council is involved include: assisting in social justice initiatives; enhancing communication of parish activities and needs through a variety of outlets; planning for upcoming parish celebrations (such as the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner); and, supporting supplemental youth ministry programs.

The Pastoral Council consists of 15 members, five of whom are elected each year for three-year terms. It also includes the School Principal, the Director of Faith Formation, and the heads or representatives of the Sodality, Finance Council, Home and School Association, School Board, and CYO. Elections will be held during April to select five council members for a term running from May 2010 until May 2013. If you are 18 years of age or older and interested in serving the parish as a member of the council, or if you wish to nominate a fellow parishioner who meets these criteria, please complete the nomination form found below and return it to the parish office by 5:00 pm, Monday, March 22.
