



**INSTRUMENTS OF THE LORD'S PEACE**

In addition to Adoration, confessions will be heard from 6:30-8:00 pm. At St. Jane de Chantal, confessions are also heard on Saturdays, from 3:45-4:45 pm.

**FOOD DRIVE**

**FASTING AND ABSTINENCE**

All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat) for those age 14 and above. On weekdays during Lent, there is no obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence (only one full meal for those age 18-59, and no meat for those age 14 and above).

**OPERATION RICE BOWL**

The story of the Prodigal Son helps us refocus on the meaning of Lent. This is a time to change our ways, to turn back to God our Father, and to appreciate and share the gifts we have received. As we begin the second half of our journey with Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl, we remember that we are called to be stewards of what God has given us, and we connect our prayers and fasting with our giving.

**PASTORAL COUNCIL ELECTIONS**

The Pastoral Council advises and assists the pastor in

achieving the goals of the parish. This includes: developing and recommending parish policies; striving to represent the needs and views of parishioners as a whole; coordinating activities among the parish organizations; and, performing other tasks to promote the mission and overall good of the parish.

The Pastoral Council does not implement programs which are the responsibility of the parish staff or parish organizations, but instead addresses issues that fall outside their purview. Some current matters in which the Pastoral Council is involved include: assisting in social justice initiatives; enhancing communication of parish activities and needs through a variety of outlets; planning for upcoming parish celebrations (such as the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner); and, supporting supplemental youth ministry programs.

The Pastoral Council consists of 15 members, five of whom are elected each year for three-year terms. It also includes the School Principal, the Director of Faith Formation, and the heads or representatives of the Sodality, Finance Council, Home and School Association, School Board, and CYO. Elections will be held during April to select five council members for a term running from May 2010 until May 2013. If you are 18 years of age or older and interested in serving the parish as a member of the council, or if you wish to nominate a fellow parishioner who meets these criteria, please complete the nomination form found below and return it to the parish office by 5:00 pm, Monday, March 22.
