LENT IN OUR PARISH

INSTRUMENTS OF THE LORD'S PEACE

This year in parishes across the Archdiocese of Washington, the sacrament of penance and Eucharistic Adoration are being held Wednesdays in Lent from 6:30-8:00 pm. Consider making a commitment to attend Holy Hour and join the Church in praying for an abundance of the healing grace of God's forgiveness and love. At St. Jane de Chantal, confessions are also heard on Saturdays, from 3:45-4:45 pm.

STATIONS OF THE CROSS

FASTING AND ABSTINENCE

All Fridays of Lent are days of abstinence (no meat) for those age 14 and above. On weekdays during Lent, there is no obligation to fast, however, voluntary acts of self-denial are recommended. Good Friday is a day of fast and abstinence (only one full meal for those age 18-59, and no meat for those age 14 and above).

OPERATION RICE BOWL

The Lenten call to repentance is matched by the overwhelming compassion and forgiveness of God. The story of the woman caught in adultery shows us that Jesus does not want to condemn us, but rather to place us on the path to new life. Our prayer, fasting, learning, and giving with Catholic Relief Services' Operation Rice Bowl opens paths to new life for our brothers and sisters in need. MASS INTENTIONS

It has long been a custom in the Catholic Church to have a Mass offered for someone who is deceased or for a special intention (i.e. for the recovery of one who is ill, an anniversary or birthday, for a special prayer). The priest then makes it his intention during Mass to remember the particular request made. If you would like to have Mass offered, you may stop by the parish office during regular business hours, or mail your request and offering to the parish office. Cards are provided by the church to send to the family of the deceased or to the person for whom the Mass is offered. It is also customary that a stipend or offering is made at the time of the request. The normal offering for a Mass, per Archdiocesan guidelines, is \$10.00. The priest does not normally announce the intention at Mass. The reason for this is that the intention is his prayer for the Mass but not necessarily the prayer of the entire community, since each one present brings to the Eucharist his or her own prayers or special intentions to offer to God. We do, however, list the Mass requests for each week in our Sunday bulletin. A Mass offered for the intentions of someone living is designated by an "L" after their name. A Mass offered for a deceased person is designated by a "D".

PASTORAL COUNCIL ELECTIONS

The Pastoral Council advises and assists the pastor in achieving the goals of the parish. This includes: developing and recommending parish policies; striving to represent the needs and views of parishioners as a whole; coordinating activities among the parish organizations; and, performing other tasks to promote the mission and overall good of the

parish.

The Pastoral Council does not implement programs which are the responsibility of the parish staff or parish organizations, but instead addresses issues that fall outside their purview. Some current matters in which the Pastoral Council is involved include: assisting in social justice initiatives; enhancing communication of parish activities and needs through a variety of outlets; planning for upcoming parish celebrations (such as the Volunteer Appreciation Dinner); and, supporting supplemental youth ministry programs.

The Pastoral Council consists of 15 members, five of whom are elected each year for three-year terms. It also includes the School Principal, the Director of Faith Formation, and the heads or representatives of the Sodality, Finance Council, Home and School Association, School Board, and CYO. Elections will be held during April to select five council members for a term running from May 2010 until May 2013. If you are 18 years of age or older and interested in serving the parish as a member of the council, or if you wish to nominate a fellow parishioner who meets these criteria, please complete the nomination form found below and return it to the parish office by 5:00 pm, Monday, March 22.
