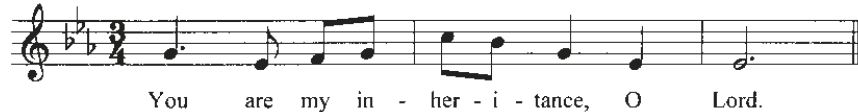

ALTAR SERVER TRAINING

Training sessions for new altar servers will be held in July. Altar servers must be at least ten years old or rising fifth graders, and must have received the sacraments of baptism and first Communion in the Catholic Church. New servers must attend a two-part training course and pass a test in order to begin serving. Servers may attend either a weekday course on July 8 and 9 (Thursday and Friday) or a Saturday course on July 17 and 24. All training sessions will take place from 9:00 to 11:00 am. The adult responsible for the new server's schedule must attend one training session on using the Ministry Scheduler Pro (MSP) web terminal. MSP training sessions will take place on Thursday, July 8, and Saturday, July 17, from 9:00 to 11:00 am. Brochures with registration forms are available in the pamphlet rack in the gathering space. REGISTRATION FOR 2010-2011

Registration for the 2010–2011 faith formation year is taking place. Registration forms can be obtained from the St. Jane website at www.stjanedechantal.org/FaithFormation.html. The registration fee must accompany the registration form, along with a certificate of baptism if this is your child's first year in faith formation. FOOT (Faith of our Toddlers), for children ages 3-4, meets Sundays during the 10:00 am Mass; Grades K-5 meet Tuesdays, 4:15-5:30 pm; Grades 6-8 meet Tuesdays, 7:00-8:15 pm; and High School meets Mondays, 7:00-9:00 pm. REGISTRATION FOR SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Registration for first penance, first Holy Communion and confirmation is taking place. A child must have been in faith formation or a Catholic school this past year in order to receive a sacrament in the 2010-2011 school year. Children from private schools outside of St. Jane must register with the Faith Formation Office in order to receive a sacrament at St. Jane. Please use the appropriate grade level registration forms found on the St. Jane website at www.stjanedechantal.org/FaithFormation.html. A certificate of baptism and the sacramental fee must accompany the registration form. Catechists and aides must go through a background check and attend an archdiocesan Child Protection Workshop in order to volunteer.
