REGISTRATION FOR SACRAMENTAL PREPARATION

Registration for first penance, first Holy Communion and confirmation is taking place. A child must have been in faith formation or a Catholic school this past year in order to receive a sacrament in the 2010-2011 school year. Children from private schools outside of St. Jane must register with the Faith Formation Office in order to receive a sacrament at St. Jane. GIFTS OF OTHER ASSETS

In addition to your cash annual charitable contributions to our parish, gifts of other assets such as stocks, bonds, mutual funds or real estate that have increased in value, can allow you an additional savings. One advantage of a stock gift is that if you have owned the stock for more than one year, then you can take an income tax deduction for the current fair market value of the stock. Normally, this is considerably higher than the original donation. Also, when you make a charitable donation, you do not have to pay a capital gains tax on the appreciation of the stock. Thus, if appreciated stock is contributed, the donor receives a greater deduction than if the stock was sold and the after-tax proceeds were contributed.
